

a vision for the community of God at Cedar Hills Church

a united community

[Nehemiah 4; Acts 2:42-47; Colossians 2:2]

We can't be the church in isolation. The Church is community, united in Jesus Christ and in mission. We see people gathering in small, midsize, and large groups for growth, support, and service. We see physical spaces that foster new connections and growing relationships. We see phenomenal communication that leverages the best available tools to keep everyone in the loop. We see a Kingdom-minded view of other local churches that affirms that we're all on God's team and that we can do more together than we could ever do alone.

a mobilized community

[Romans 12:1-7; Ephesians 4:11-13]

The mission of Cedar Hills will only succeed as it is lived out by every person in our church. Every person is uniquely suited for serving in the Kingdom of God—benchwarming is not an option. We see people clamoring to serve. We see people caring for people in and beyond our church—especially for the lost, the least, and the left out. We see people serving around the world. We see intentional development of energized, supported leaders. We see leadership shared widely and well to activate God's work through God's people.

a generous community

[Proverbs 11:25; Mark 6:34-44; Luke 6:38; 2 Corinthians 8:7; 1 Thessalonians 2:8]

In response to the God who generously gives abundant life to us, we see a community that models God-like generosity. This overflowing generosity begins with a wide-open invitation to every person in North Idaho to experience life, hope and the transforming power of Jesus Christ. This selfless generosity grows as people serve from the heart in the Kingdom of God. This reckless generosity spurs cheerful, mind-blowing giving that funds far more than an annual budget. We see a church that joyfully partners with other organizations that bring life to others, giving away \$1 million annually to God's work in our area and around the world.

a viral community

[Matthew 28:18-20; Philippians 2:1-4]

The Kingdom of God is not static—it's a kingdom on the move. We see new, creative, God-sized ways to participate in the Kingdom of God. We see people sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with their families, friends, teammates, co-workers, and neighbors in natural, relational ways. We see people mentoring others to develop healthy families, vibrant relationships, growing devotion to Jesus Christ, and lives freed from the addictive power of idols. We see a church model that replicates itself in every zip code in North Idaho. We see Cedar Hills resourcing other churches to extend the Kingdom of God.

a God-honoring community

[Exodus 3:1-22; Ephesians 1:17-21]

The ultimate focus of Cedar Hills isn't numbers, programs, buildings, plans, resources, volunteers, or weekend gatherings. The ultimate focus of Cedar Hills is the glory of God, reflected in God's people. We see a historic move of God through Cedar Hills and other churches in North Idaho that transforms individuals, families, churches, companies, schools and government offices in our area. We see intentional prayer and patient obedience at every level paving the way for this transformation.
